Subject: Monthly Fire Chief Update – November 2022

Stephanie Caughey hired as Fire Inspector



Stephanie Caughey was hired in November as Community Risk Reduction's newest Fire Inspector. She started her career in the fire service in 2017 with San Ramon Valley Fire where she worked in Fire Prevention. Prior to starting her career in the fire service, she worked in Law Enforcement for five years. She lives in Mountain House with her husband, and their two children, who are her pride and joy. Recruit Graduation Ceremony

Our eight Firefighter recruits graduated from the Stockton Fire Academy on November 16th in a ceremony at the Arnold Rue Branch Library in Stockton. All recruits are currently serving as Probationary Firefighters with South San Joaquin County Fire Authority and started their first shifts the week of November 20th. They will be recognized during the Badge Pinning Ceremony on December 20th.





Training

During November, the South County Fire Authority Division of Training continued to facilitate all risk emergency training events.

- Paramedic and EMT Infrequently used skills
- The department sent five personnel to Peer Support Training
- DOT and online personnel worked with all eight probationary firefighters to prepare them with department specific operations for multiple days prior to them graduating their academy
- Probationary Firefighters were trained on wildland fire ground operations and our Type
 3 apparatus
- Probationary Firefighters were trained on structure fire ops and our Type 1 engines
- Probationary Firefighters were trained on our reporting systems and other computer platforms we have

Six of the eight new recruits are Paramedics and three are accredited in San Joaquin County. The other three are being sent to Manteca District Ambulance (MDA). SCFA has entered into an MOU with MDA to allow SCFA employees to complete the accreditation process through MDA.

At the company level our firefighters are training daily to better prepare themselves to assist in mitigating emergencies in our community. Personnel logged over 2000 hours of training in the month of November.

The Division of Training always supports the mission of the Fire Authority and its duty to provide a well-trained and professional fire agency to serve our community.

Continuing Education Provider Audit

The Continuing Education provider status for the South County Fire Authority has been restored after multiple meetings with the San Joaquin County EMS Agency (SJCEMSA). A policy was written and accepted by the SJCEMSA and will be added to the Authority policy manual.

Badge Pinning Ceremony

The Fire Authority's Annual Badge Pinning Ceremony will be held on December 20th at the Grand Theatre. The annual event recognizes members that have received promotions over the past year. The eight new recruits will also be recognized. Formal invitations were mailed out before Thanksgiving and staff is busy finalizing all event details.


Significant Incidents

November 16, 2022 – Crews responded to a report of 500 – 1000 gallons of fuel that leaked from a tanker truck just before 10:30 PM. Upon arrival, crews found that the tanker truck jackknifed and ruptured its own tank. A total of 700 gallons of gasoline were cleaned up using multiple bags of absorbent. The City of Tracy's Public Works staff along with Environmental Health assisted in the efforts.




November 2022 Response Data

There were 876 total reported incidents in the month of November 2022. EMS incidents continue to be the predominant incident type (571 incidents comprising 65% of all calls for service). While where were 876 calls for service, it is important to note that some calls require multiple apparatus. In total there were 1331 total apparatus responses in November.



Station 91 continues to be the busiest fire station in the month of November. There are two staffed units responding from Station 91; Truck 91 and Engine 91. Station 94 and 97 have also increased over the last month. All other fire stations are staffed with a single fire engine.



The Joint Powers Agreement of the South San Joaquin County Fire Authority states the Chief Executive Officer will provide the Board of Directors a report on the staffing levels at each station. Authority fire engines and the ladder truck are staffed with 3 persons each. There is one Battalion Chief on duty each day to supervise one of three shifts.









MONTHLY COMPLETED INSPECTION COMPARISON




YTD FIRE INSPECTION OVERVIEW

Completed Fire Inspections Per Zone:




Completed Fire Inspections Per Type:

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
ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES

- 37 new construction permits were issued in November
